

Now one can hardly see any footpath which has been spared by the encroachers. As a consequence, pedestrians are forced to walk on the main road, which is hazardous. 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

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People living there are fed up with the situation. "Everything was fine until eight years back when a few people sought permission to sell items on the footpath outside the mosque. They were permitted to do so by the mosque committee on condition that they would not obstruct the way of those coming to say prayers. But after some time they usurped the land and encroached upon the whole foothpath and upto 10 feet of the 35 feet wide main road," said Malik Naseer Ahmad, a known social worker in the area

"At times the situation is so bad that a couple of patients even died on the way as it was the only conduit to take them to the hospital," said Deputy Nazim (Naib Nazim) Razaul Karim Butt. He added, "the government funds are allocated as per party affiliation and that is why this area is paying heavily for its loyalty to the previous government. A reaction to this negligence has been evident from the election results in the area.
