deas are the backbone of the society and for every developing society the role of productive ideas

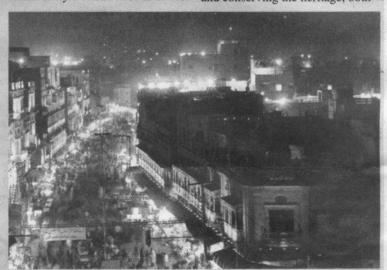
